


REVIEW OF GOD'S WORD

INTRODUCTION

- 1. Faith begins with Knowledge of God
- What we have learned about God thus far (From our reading of Genesis)

- 3. The Knowledge of God

REVIEW OF ABRAM'S FAITH-RELATIONSHIP WITH GOD

- 1. He believed in God
 - a. That God had called him out of his homeland to a new country
 - b. That God would bless as He had promised
 - c. That God would protect him as he travelled for thousands of kilometers
 - d. His knowledge and faith in God continued to grow
- 2. His belief empowered him
 - a. To be kind and gracious
 - b. To be good and forgiving
 - c. To be brave and strong enough
 - i. To fight the Northern Coalition of kings
 - ii. To defeat them
 - iii. To rescue Lot and others who had been taken prisoner

THE DANGER THAT WAS VERY REAL

- 琛
- 1. The Revenge of the Northern Coalition of kings
 - a. They had been defeated
 - b. They had been humiliated
 - i. Abraham had such a small army
 - ii. He wasn't even a kingdom
 - c. They could easily return and attack Abram with an even larger force
- 2. Abram would not be able to defend himself
 - a. If the Northern Coalition of kings decide to come back to attack
 - b. If the kings of the Southern Coalition turned against Abram
 - i. Many were wild
 - ii. They were wicked (Sodom and Gomorrah)



GOD'S PROMISE TO ABRAM

1. It was called "The word of the LORD"

Genesis 15:1a

2. It was given in "a vision"

Genesis 15:1b

a. A graphic portrayal

b. Abram could see this "shield" of God

3. The content of this "word of the LORD"

a. "Do not be afraid"

Genesis 15:1c

i. It was natural to be afraid

ii. The threat was very real

iii. God allayed Abram's fears

b. "I am your shield" Genesis 15:1d

i. To symbolize protection

ii. To symbolize power

c. "Your exceedingly great reward"

i. This was an additional promise

ii. Abram had refused any material award


iii. God Himself would be his reward

iv. It would be the very best reward ever

APPLICATION OF THE DOCTRINE OF PROTECTION

LEARNING HOW KING DAVID APPLIED THIS TRUTH IN HIS LIFE

1. Believing in Personal Protection from enemies

"But You, O LORD, are a shield for me,
My glory and the One who lifts up my head.
I cried to the LORD with my voice,
And He heard me from His holy hill."

Psalm 3:3-4

- a. He believed that God was his shieldb. He prayed with faith in his heart
- 2. Trusting in Protection of God's People

"But let all those rejoice who put their trust in You;
Let them ever shout for joy, because You defend them;
Let those also who love Your name
Be joyful in You.
For You, O LORD, will bless the righteous;
With favor You will surround him as with a shield."
Psalm 5:11-12

- a. Trusting in God's defence
- b. God will be a shield to the righteous

The Lord as Abram's shield and reward

As Abram faced the threat of a revenge of the Northern Coalition of kings, he was physically unable to defend himself. However, despite the trying circumstances, he put his trust in the Lord. The Lord, being loving and gracious, allayed Abram's fears with His word. Previously, God had already empowered him to be brave and strong enough to defeat his enemies, and even save Lot and others who were imprisoned. From this, we see how Abram's application of genuine faith was immediately reciprocated by

God in the form of protection and provision, with the Lord as his shield and reward.

Learning to let the Lord be our personal shield

Just as God was a shield to Abram, we can trust that He can and will be our personal shield too. Growing up in church, I have struggled with remaining stagnant at a theoretical faith and found it difficult to apply faith regularly in my life.

However, I have come to learn that a theoretical faith alone will not suffice to stand us in good state. Rather, acknowledging our imperfections, lying aside our pride, and exercising faith by trusting in God to be our powerful protector is a much better approach to combating life's seemingly insurmountable challenges. Only then will we be able to personally experience the Lord as our protector and develop our relationship with Him.

Joy found in a personal and real faith

The Lord blesses us with His protection as we develop a genuine faith and close relationship with Him. This naturally brings us comfort knowing that He is always near to defend us. Having a real faith in the Lord helps us to relate to Him, bringing a special sense of joy to the heart knowing that we can share our burdens with Him and He can help us overcome them victoriously. Simply knowing that the Lord is on our side and He will not fail gives us many reasons to proclaim His power each and every day.

May we all be challenged to convert our head knowledge into applicable faith in the Lord, and strive for a faith that is as strong as Abram's!
