  - a) The problem of unbelief persists
  - b) Abraham struggled with this difficulty
  - c) Sarah struggled with this problem too
- 4. God desires to help us overcome the problem of unbelief He wants us to have a clearer and stronger faith!

1. The LORD appeared to Abram at Mamre

- Genesis 18:1a
- a) This was a record of a physical appearance
- b) The other times may not have been physical/literal appearances
- c) Nevertheless, those words from the LORD were real and true
- 2. Abram was sitting at his tent door in the heat of the day Genesis 18:1b
  - a) "The heat of the day" It can be very hot!
  - b) Sitting at his tent door Wisely so

#### A SPECIAL VISIT FROM HEAVENLY VISITORS

- 1. Three men were approaching his tent
- 2. Seeing the Heavenly Visitors
  - a) "He lifted his eyes and looked"
  - b) "And behold, three men were standing by him" Genesis 18:2b
- 3. Greeting the Heavenly Visitors
  - a) "He ran to them"
  - b) "He bowed himself to them"

1. Alerting Sarah

b) "Took a tender and good calf" Genesis 18:7b

c) "Gave it to a young man, Genesis 18:7c

and he hastened to prepare it"

3. Personal Service

a) "So he took butter and milk" Genesis 18:8a

b) "And the calf which he had prepared

and set it before them" Genesis 18:8b

c) "And he stood by them under the tree

as they ate" Genesis 18:8c

#### **CONVERSATION WITH THE HEAVENLY GUESTS**

1. Polite and genuine Inquiry about the family

"Where is Sarah your wife?" Genesis 18:9a

2. Abraham's reply

"Here, in the tent" Genesis 18:9b

3. A blessing promised

a) Another visit
"I will certainly return to you

according to the time of life" Genesis 18:10a

b) A son promised

"Sarah, your wife shall have a son"

Genesis 18:10b

#### 4. Sarah

a) "Sarah was listening in the tent door which was behind him"

Genesis 18:10c

b) Comment

"Now Abraham and Sarah were old. well-advanced in age; and Sarah had passed the age of childbearing" Genesis 18:11

c) Sarah laughed

"Therefore Sarah laughed within herself, saying, 'After I have grown old, shall I have pleasure, My lord being old also?"

Genesis 18:12

#### THE LORD'S OMNISCIENCE

1. A question

"Why did Sarah laugh, saying, 'Shall I surely bear a child, since I am old?"

Genesis 18:13

2. Another question

"Is anything too hard for the LORD?"

Genesis 18:14a

3. The next visit

"At the appointed time I will return to you, according to the time of life, and Sarah shall have a son."

Genesis 18:14b

4. Sarah's protest

a) Denial

"But Sarah denied it, saying, 'I did not laugh'"

b) Fear

"For she was afraid"

Genesis 18:15a

Genesis 18:15b

- 5. The LORD's insistence
  - a) He was, of course, right
  - b) He was the Omniscient LORD
    - i) He heard her
    - ii) He knew what she said (though not recorded)

#### **CONCLUSION**

- 1. God's Communion with His children
  - a) He will communicate in different ways
  - b) He will send a word now and then to us
- 2. Our Part
  - a) To cultivate knowledge
  - b) To develop sensitivity
  - c) To make appropriate response to the Lord
- 3. God's Desire
  - a) To help us overcome our Unbelief
  - b) He wants us to know that there is nothing too hard for the LORD

## REFLECTION

At last week's Youth Worship Service, we continued learning about the problem of unbelief. The Lord had promised that Sarah would bear a son, but both Abraham and Sarah were well beyond their years and Sarah was past child-bearing age. How could they possibly believe that this would come to pass?

#### The problem of unbelief

In Genesis 18, we see that Sarah still struggled to believe in the Lord's word. When the Lord affirmed His blessing to Abraham, that Sarah would bear him a son, Sarah laughed within her heart because she doubted the possibility of her bearing a child. Sarah knew that with her human limitations, it would be impossible to bear a child. However, God does not have the human limitations we face- nothing is impossible for Him!

#### The problem behind unbelief

We often have the tendency to make the same mistake as Sarah. When faced with a situation that seems impossible, or too difficult to bear, we tend to focus on our own limitations and weaknesses. When all we see is our own inabilities, we fail to recognise God's abilities that far surpass our own. We cannot use human logic to try to fathom God's ways. His ways are higher than ours, His wisdom far surpasses ours.

The problem of unbelief is one that can persist if we do not tackle it. Sarah's unbelief still remained despite the Lord repeatedly affirming His blessing to her. Though the Lord does His part by communicating with us and reaching out to us with His Word, we also have a part to play to deal with the problem of unbelief.

#### **Dealing with unbelief**

It is difficult to put your trust in someone you do not know well. Similarly, it is difficult to believe God's Word if we do not know Him personally. Our part is to cultivate our knowledge of the Lord and His Word. Through private Scripture reading, and by seeking the Lord, we will be able to know the Lord. When we know this omniscient God on a personal level, we will be better able to believe and trust in His Word.

We can also seek to cultivate a greater consciousness of the Lord. Just like how God reached out to Abraham over the course of years and years, appearing to Him in various means, and giving him a word each time, the Lord also seeks to develop a relationship with us. Looking back at previous chapters of Genesis, we see how the Lord was patiently guiding and teaching Abraham new lessons of faith. The Lord wants to help us address our problem of unbelief. He will do His part by giving us His Word, we must respond and receive His Word appropriately! Let us seek to have Abraham's humility and allow the Lord to teach and instruct us.
