COME AND WORSHIP

"Do not hide Your face from me"

David had agreed to the Lord's exhortation to seek His face. How did he go about doing that? We read of his subsequent response.

"Do not hide Your face from me;
Do not turn Your servant away in anger;
You have been my help;
Do not leave me nor forsake me,
O God of my salvation."

PSALM 27:9

- 1. David pleaded with the God of his salvation
 - a. Do not hide Your face from me
 - b. Do not turn Your servant away in anger
 - c. Do not leave me or forsake me
- 2. Why did David make this plea?
 - a. It was God who had asked David to seek His face
 - i. Why would He hide His face?
 - ii. Why would He be angry with David?
 - b. David was fearful
 - i. He had seen how God distanced Himself from King Saul (1 Samuel 15-16)
 - ii. He feared that the Lord could also hide His face from him
 - iii. He was afraid that he could also be rejected and abandoned by God

- 3. David's self-awareness as he approached God
 - a. His sinfulness
 - i. Sin would arouse the anger of God
 - ii. It would separate him from the Lord
 - b. He was only a servant to God
 - c. He needed God and His help

CULTIVATING A HEALTHY GODLY FEAR

As David sought to know the Lord more deeply, he was filled with godly fear. Who was he before the Righteous and Sovereign God? Even though David would dwell in the Lord's house and his heart was desirous to learn more about Him, these did not make him any less of a sinner. His sinful nature could still arouse God's righteous anger. Humbly and appropriately, David pleaded for God's mercy to not hide His face nor His grace from him.

At times, we run into the danger of approaching God too casually. We may even be presumptuous to think that He is with us and would help us. Let us develop an understanding and consciousness of how sinful we are. Some sins are blatant and obvious, while some others are so insidious that we may not even be aware of them. We too, must come to recognise our own sinfulness and plead that God would not hide His face from us!

GOD REACHES OUT TO JACOB

- 1. God gave Jacob a dream
 - a. Often called "Jacob's Ladder"
 - b. A ladder that led all the way to heaven Genesis 28:12a
 - c. Angels were ascending and descending Genesis 28:12b

2. God speaks to Jacob

13 And behold, the LORD stood above it and said: "I am the LORD God of Abraham your father and the God of Isaac; the land on which you lie I will give to you and your descendants.

14 Also your descendants shall be as the dust of the earth; you shall spread abroad to the west and the east, to the north and the south; and in you and in your seed all the families of the earth shall be blessed.

15 Behold, I am with you and will keep you wherever you go, and will bring you back to this land; for I will not leave you until I have done what I have spoken to you."

- **20** Then Jacob made a vow, saying, "If God will be with me, and keep me in this way that I am going, and give me bread to eat and clothing to put on,
- 21 so that I come back to my father's house in peace, then the Lord shall be my God.
- **22** And this stone which I have set as a pillar shall be God's house, and of all that You give me I will surely give a tenth to You."

Last week, we continued from when Jacob was making his way towards Haran. As things seemed to be getting worse for Jacob, we read about a beautiful encounter between God and Jacob in the wilderness.

As Jacob travelled further and further away from home, he must have had a lot on his mind. The recent incident with his family had forced him to leave his home in search of his uncle. Jacob must have been scared, distressed and uncomfortable. Despite everything he was going through, Jacob's exhaustion got the better of him and he fell asleep. This was when God reached out to him through a beautiful dream and introduced Himself to Jacob. Although Jacob had not developed a relationship with God, the Lord graciously and lovingly reached out to him. Some of us might find ourselves in a similar situation as Jacob: he grew up with parents who knew the Lord and was exposed to God from a young age, but this did not mean he had the same faith as his father. Personally, I sometimes ask myself - is my faith my own or is it my parents? It is crucial that we take time to check ourselves and evaluate if we truly have a faith we can call



Jacob's Responses


After Jacob's encounter with God through the dream, he had a few responses. Initially, he recognised his ignorance towards God and developed a fear and reverence for Him. Though Jacob would have heard about this God from his father and grandfather, he did not show any interest nor understanding until this point in his life. Jacob's second response was a heartening one. He set up an altar and made a vow to God, signifying the beginning of his relationship with God.



When we are on a spiritual high after activities such as Youth Conference, it is easier to give a good response. However, when all these emotions die down and we revert back to our mundane daily routines, it may be significantly harder to give that same genuine and certain response similar to Jacob's.

Our Response

Even though God no longer speaks to us through dreams like He did with Jacob, He still reaches out to each of us. There is no doubt that He is speaking to us, through messages from Pastor or lessons from our Sunday School teachers. Hopefully, last week's message got you thinking: Have I developed a personal relationship with God yet? If your answer was no, start today! God is lovingly reaching out to you, waiting for your response. May we all seek to cultivate a far deeper and personal relationship with this awesome God we have!
