

  - b. To cultivate a proper fear of the Lord


- 3. How does God follow through?

## Hear the Call of the Kingdom



That the life of Christ may shine through us.




King of Heaven,

## **REVIEW OF GOD'S WORD**

Let us review what we have learnt at our last Youth Worship!

### YWS MESSAGE - 6 AUGUST 2022 "WICKED IN THE SIGHT OF THE LORD" GENESIS 38:7

#### **INTRODUCTION**

- 1. The family of Jacob
  - a. It was dysfunctional
  - b. It was in danger
- 2. Jacob
  - a. He was in deep grief over the loss of Joseph
  - b. He did not seem to relate much to his other children

#### THE STORY OF JUDAH

- 1. His involvement in Joseph's plight
- 2. He suggested selling Joseph to the Midianite traders

Genesis 37:26-28

- 3. He did not want to see Joseph killed by the brothers
- 4. But how good was it to sell Joseph away?

#### **GOING AWAY FROM THE FAMILY**

1. He departed from his brothers

Genesis 38:1a

- a. His reasons were not made known
- b. But this was a departure from the usual practice
- 2. Normal Practice of ancient families
  - a. The family stays together
    - i. The siblings work together
    - ii. They support each other
    - iii. To depart was unusual
  - b. It would be very hard to make it on your own
    - i. No support
    - ii. Grave challenges abound

#### **GOING TO ADULLAM**

- 1. This was an ancient city
- 2. It even had a ruler of the city-state
- 3. It was one of the cities of Canaan
- 4. Judah had an Adullamite friend in Hirah
- Genesis 38:1b

- a. Perhaps a business partner
- b. He became a friend with whom Judah stayed

#### MARRYING AN ADULLAMITE GIRL

- 1. The girl's name was Shua
- 2. Judah married her
- 3. They had 3 sons

c. Shelah

a. Er Genesis 38:3b. Onan Genesis 38:4

Genesis 38:5

#### THE SONS OF JUDAH

1. Er, the Firstborn

a. He was wicked in the sight of the LORD Genesis 38:7a

b. He was so wicked; the LORD slew him Genesis 38:7b

- 2. His wicked deeds
  - a. These were not made known
  - b. But they were wicked enough for God to take action against him severely

#### THE LEVIRATE MARRIAGE

- 1. The word "Levirate" comes from the Latin
- 2. It means "Brother-in-law"
- 3. How the Levirate system works:
  - a. The brother-in-law marries the brother's widow
  - b. The first-born son will not be considered his son
  - c. This son would be considered the son of the dead brother
  - d. Subsequently, all other children would be considered his own children

#### THE WICKEDNESS OF ONAN

- 1. He obeyed Judah, his father
- 2. He married Tamar
- 3. But he did not like to have his firstborn named after his departed older brother
- 4. He did a wicked thing
  - a. He spilled his semen on the ground
  - b. Thus, Tamar would not have any children Genesis 38:9

5. The LORD slew him for his wickedness

Genesis 38:10

#### THE FAMILY OF JUDAH

- 1. Failure of Judah
  - a. As a son to his father, Jacob
  - b. As a brother to his siblings
  - c. As a father to his sons
  - d. He was more concerned about himself than he was about his family
- 2. Failure of the sons
  - a. Er was so wicked, God slew him
  - b. Onan was as wicked and God slew him too
  - c. They showed similar characteristics:
    - i. There was wickedness
    - ii. There was self-interest

#### CONCLUSION

- 1. Problems that can affect us adversely
  - a. The LORD did not feature at all
  - b. There was no faith to speak of
  - c. Wickedness was allowed to have the upper hand
- 2. Our Challenge
  - a. To check whether God is a part of our life
  - b. To check if we are harbouring wickedness in our heart
  - c. To return to God and to ask for cleansing of our life

#### Last week at Youth Worship

We learnt how Joseph's brothers had sold him, and they eventually chose to deceive their father, leaving the latter to believe that his son was dead. After Joseph's death, Jacob wept greatly over the death of his favourite son and refused to be comforted. The pain led the family to become even more dysfunctional. Soon after, Judah left his family, where he eventually settled down and married a Canaanite. This led the family to greater disarray, as Judah's household was full of wickedness, which made the Lord strike dead two of his sons.

#### The danger of wickedness

Wickedness is not just a danger that merely exists in Judah's household. In our world today, it has become so ever-present. We see this in the form of political conflicts, wars, un-called for shootings and even the surge in crime rates in our country. Even though such forms of wickedness may seem extreme, sin lies at our door. Sin can come in the form of pride in our hearts or even deceit. Hence, there is a need for all of us to watch out for sin, and to deal with it with great haste before it escalates to a deeper problem of wickedness. From what Pastor has mentioned during last week's Worship, wickedness should never be part of our lives and thus should never be a choice.

#### Letting faith triumph over sin

Reflecting on these lessons, I am greatly challenged to deepen my faith in the Lord. I too fall prey to sin in my life. There are times when I choose to compare with what others have and complain about what I am lacking in my life. There are also times when I fail to control my emotions and eventually fall into the sin of anger and impatience. Yet, despite all my failings, the Lord has continued to show His great love and mercy, helping me to see His hand and that only He is able to blot out these sins from my life.

As young people, let us seek to learn these lessons well now. Let us strive to not follow Judah's footsteps as he entered a greater path of sin when he left his family and omitted the Lord. I am deeply challenged to constantly involve the Lord in my life, through the good or bad times. As children of God, may we seek to constantly abide by His Word, be conscious of the sins in our lives and seek to include faith in whatever we do. Only the Lord is able to cleanse us from our sins. All we need is to go to Him in prayer, humbly asking Him to forgive us and grant us the strength to overcome the temptations in life. Though wickedness will continue in our world, let us seek to be beacons of light as we shine brightly for the Lord, knowing that He has been and will always be there for us in times of need.
