

# Dear Pastor Charlie, Pastor Mark, Pastor Mitch and the pastoral team and all our Bethany family,

Thank you for the precious ministry to us during this period of bereavement and loss. It means so much to our family what everyone at the Bethany family, our relatives and friends have done to support us during this time.

As the funeral is over, we settle down to the harder part— the living and moving forward. There are a few things that we hold on to :

- 1) God's Word preached to give us **God's perspective**. When we felt that we had lost everything. Jon would have said to us "He is our everything".
- 2) The encouragement to measure life by its **strength**, **not its length**. Jon wrote in a post "When Jesus died on the cross, he said "'My work is done." I believe that is our purpose in life, to find and complete our work here. To me, that is sufficient explanation of the duration of our lives."
- 3) "That you may believe"— that our faith may be augmented and grown to the next level. We have a faith worth holding fast to— a faith that enables us to take sickness, and now to take even death of a beloved husband, son, brother, brother-in-law and uncle.
- 4) The **significance** of Jon's 45 years. Jon's constant question to us was "What is your <u>purpose</u> in life?" He told Mom, Lynn and Val recently "This is the verse I was talking about, that the basic instruction for our purpose is to help others: "For we are God's masterpiece. It is God himself who has made us what we are and given us new lives from Christ Jesus, and long ages ago he planned that we should spend these lives in helping others" (Ephesians 2:10)". Over the three days of the wake, we met many friends from all walks of life, marketplace ministry groups, business

owners at his work-place, business partners, the angling community, charity partners and friends who grieved with us and told us about the impact he had made on their lives. Some said he had helped them in their business and finances, others how he inspired them to involve God in their business, helped them in their walk with God, used his mark-eting and technology skills in fundraising for The Autism Network and creation of "5 Loaves and 2 Fishes" for the F&B industry, and yet others for his genuine friendship.

5) And the greatest assurance and comfort that **Jon is now safe in the arms of Jesus**, and he would have wanted us to continue to find joy in our lives.

In a text to our uncle, Jon said ""Consider it <u>pure joy</u> to suffer for the Lord" means to me all good and bad are intended for (our) own good. I should not complain or judge, as the Lord knows what I need. But instead, I can be truly joyful in my countenance and attitude, reflected in my passion and enthusiasm to make a bigger impact on all that I do. Therefore, joy is an understated value and attitude that we work towards, where there's pure joy, the rewards are more abundant."

We are grateful to the church family and our relatives and family who have helped us look up from our grief, and towards the Lord. We want to focus on emulating Jon's faith and his wish for us to "eat more of the fruits of the Spirit".
