

Moses had devoted 40 years of his life in serving the Lord. His focus was well-stated in the following text:

Give ear, O heavens, and I will speak; And hear, O earth, the words of my mouth.

² Let my teaching drop as the rain, My speech distill as the dew, As raindrops on the tender herb, And as showers on the grass. Deuteronomy 32:1-2

- 1. Confidence of Moses in speaking
 - a) He addressed "heaven" and "earth"
 - b) He would "speak" to them with "the words of his mouth"
- 2. Content of what Moses would say
 - a) It was "his teaching"
 - b) It was "his speech"
- 3. Comparisons made
 - a) It is compared to the rain
 - i) Raindrops on the tender herb
 - ii) Showers on the grass
 - b) It is also compared to the dew
 - i) Gentle
 - ii) Refreshing

Now you shall speak to him and put the words in his mouth. And I will be with your mouth and with his mouth, and I will teach you what you shall do. Exodus 4:15

- 1. Moses had declared the following things to God:
 - a) "I am not eloquent"
 - a) "I am slow of speech"
 - b) "And slow of tongue" Exodus 4:10
- 2. God's response
 - a) I will be with your mouth and with his mouth
 - b) I will teach you what you shall do Exodus 4:15

God patiently taught Moses all that he needed to know and to do as His servant!
