COME AND WORSHIP

Pilgrimages in ancient days were long and arduous journeys. It would take one who is true and faithful to undertake the challenge in order to fulfil God's requirement to travel to Jerusalem for worship at appointed times of the year.

"As they pass through the Valley of Baca,
They make it a spring;
The rain also covers it with pools.
They go from strength to strength;
Each one appears before God in Zion."

PSALM 84:3-4

- 1. Challenges of a pilgrim's journey
 - a. "Valley of Baca"
 - i. This is not referring to a geographical location
 - ii. It is a symbolic reference
 - iii. The word "Baca" means "tears"
 - iv. The pilgrims faced challenges that brought tears to the eyes
 - b. Finding water for survival
 - i. It would not have been feasible to carry all the supplies needed to last the whole journey
 - ii. The pilgrims would need to find water along the way
 - iii. They remained undeterred and would find a solution to this problem
 - iv. They dug the ground and found springs of water that refreshed them!

COME AND WORSHIP

- 2. The assurance of God's blessings
 - a. The pilgrims experienced help from God
 - b. Physically, He led them to find springs and gave rain
 - c. Spiritually, they grew from strength to strength
 - d. Their endeavour to keep God's commandment was blessed with success
 - e. They safely appeared before God in Zion (Jerusalem)

While such a journey is not required of us today, we can translate the experience of ancient pilgrimages to our life on earth. Earth is not our final destination. We journey through our life here until we arrive in Heaven.

In this life, we will face challenges that bring sorrow and tears, but we need not let the problems of life bring us down. We can find solutions to our problems. 

REFLECTION

Last week at Youth Worship, we learned about the consequences of sin and the problems of the human heart after Lot and his daughters escaped from Sodom and Gomorrah.

Lot's family degradation

Throughout Lot's journey, we see the poor choices that Lot made from the time when he left his uncle Abraham to dwell in the wicked twin cities, to the time when he chose to dwell in the mountains after his escape from the destruction of Sodom and Gomorrah. He had chosen to rely on his own human understanding instead of placing his trust in the Lord, and these choices led to grave consequences. He had lost everything. The sense of degeneration because of his sin led him to be almost unrecognisable - a dejected man who had faded out from Biblical history.

The degeneration was perpetuated by the wicked plan of Lot's daughters. They chose to commit incest with their father, giving birth to 2 sons, who would fail to grow up well and would become perpetual enemies of Israel.

To not lean on our own understanding

Lot's family serves as a warning to us regarding the gravity of sin. When we choose to rely on our understanding, this can cause us to be vulnerable to the problems of sin. We face severe and devastating consequences if such sins continue to remain uncorrected. Sin can become such a fatal part of our lives, causing us to drift further from our walk with the Lord.

REFLECTION

However, we can rejoice in the knowledge that the Lord will be there for us along the way, and such sins can be corrected when we choose to go back to the Lord and His Word. We can learn to place our trust in the Lord and not lean on our understanding as we continue our journey in life (Proverbs 3:5-6).

Contrary to Lot, Abraham chose to place his trust in the Lord and not to rely on his human understanding.

Though there were times when he faltered, he continued to press on in his faith and to depend on the Lord for much strength throughout his journey to the promised land of Canaan.

The challenge to believe

Let us learn to understand and see with eyes of faith at the crossroads of life, and as we go through difficult situations. Our human knowledge is limited and it can fail us, which drives us to seek the Lord's guidance. As we enter into the new week of school or work, may we continue to choose faith and not to descend on the path of sin. We can strive to involve the Lord so much more in our lives, by starting the day with reading His word, consulting Him in our decisions and learning to turn to the Lord in trust and prayer amidst the difficulties of life. Let us seek to grow our faith that we may eventually bear fruit in due time!

POETRY CORNER


ALL THE LAND WHICH YOU SEE I GIVE TO YOU
