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COME AND WORSHIP

The superscription of Psalm 92 tells us that the Psalm was written as a song for the Sabbath day. The Sabbath day was not just a day of rest. The people were commanded to keep the day holy (Exodus 20:8). The faithful would worship God either in public or in their private homes. In this Psalm, we catch a glimpse of worship on the Sabbath.

"It is good to give thanks to the LORD,

And to sing praises to Your name, O Most High;

To declare Your lovingkindness in the morning,

And Your faithfulness every night."

PSALM 92:1-2

- 1. Reflect on the name of God
 - a. God is the center of our worship
 - b. His name represents who He is
 - c. We are reminded of God's proclamation of His name in Exodus 34:6:

"The LORD, the LORD God, merciful and gracious, longsuffering, and abounding in goodness and truth."

- 2. Recount the blessings of God
 - a. God's blessings come in many forms
 - b. Two aspects highlighted for us to consider
 - i. His lovingkindness
 - ii. His faithfulness

- 3. Respond with thanksgiving
 - a. Give thanks to the LORD
 - b. Sing songs of praise to His name
 - c. Declare the wonderful truths about Him

Taking time to reflect on God's name and to recount His blessings are good practices to cultivate, not only during Youth Worship alone, but also every morning and night. When our hearts and minds are saturated with the thoughts of God and His goodness towards us, heartfelt thanksgiving and praise would flow from us.

- 2. She was scoffing at Isaac
- 3. Sarah noticed Ishmael scoffing Genesis 21:9
 - a) This was uncalled for
 - b) This was unwise
 - c) This reflected a negative attitude
 - d) The word "scoffing" is a play on words Its root idea is "laughing"
 - e) Laughter

ii) Sarah's laughter	Genesis 18:12-13
iii) Sarah's (new) laughter	Genesis 21:6
iv) Ishmael's scoffing (laughter)	Genesis 21:9

HUGE NEGATIVE CONSEQUENCES


- 1. Sarah's demand of Abraham

1. Wives

Sarah and Hagar were officially wives of Abraham

2. Sons and Heirs

Isaac and Ishmael were legitimate sons and heirs of Abraham

REFLECTION



The faithfulness of God

Abraham's journey of faith was one that had not been smooth-sailing. We have seen how he had stumbled from time to time when he chose to rely on his own understanding. However, despite the challenges and weaknesses, the Lord remained faithful to the end. He continued to provide for Abraham and blessed him with children -lsaac and Ishmael. Last week, we saw how relying on one's human understanding can lead to grave consequences through Sarah's negative example.

The birth of Ishmael

Ishmael was the first child of Abraham, conceived by Hagar when Abraham and Sarah faltered in their faith and decided to fall back on their 'human plan' of conceiving an heir. Ishmael's birth had resulted in conflict in the family, as it had stirred vengeful feelings in Sarah, who saw Hagar as a great threat.

Sarah's problems of unbelief and flawed human reasoning

Instead of choosing to focus on her faith in the Lord, Sarah relied on her own carnal human reasoning; knowledge borne by the flesh. She had allowed her mother's instinct to protect Isaac's inheritance as well as her vengeful emotions to take over her. This led her to make the cruel decision of demanding Abraham to cast Ishmael and Hagar out.

Previously, Sarah had despised and mistreated Hagar, which drove Hagar to flee from her master (Genesis 16). Years later, Sarah's ill feelings towards Hagar remained unchanged and she continued to deem Hagar as just a 'bondwoman.'

Sarah's poor treatment of Hagar was a result of two deep-seated problems. Firstly, it stemmed from a heart of unbelief. She failed to place her trust in the Lord's promise that Isaac would be the promised son (Genesis 15:4). Instead, she allowed her fears and insecurities to overwhelm her. She knew she would not be able to protect Isaac from Hagar and Ishmael after her death. Secondly, she chose to rely on her own human understanding, letting her rage and anger fuel her. Her decision to cast Hagar and Ishmael out would inflict much pain on them.

Cultivating a strong faith

Like Sarah, I too, sometimes allow my unbelief and human understanding to drive my choices. This has led me to make unwise decisions in my life.

Despite these setbacks in our faith, it is important for us to return to the Lord and His Word. It is heartening to know that the Lord has always been with us, at every step of the way, teaching and guiding us with His Word. Let's seek to go beyond repentance of our sins, to grow our relationship with the Lord and learn to be more conscious of the Lord each day. May we seek to battle unbelief by cultivating a strong and vibrant faith in the Lord!
