

1. The Preparation

- a) The children of Israel had to make special effort to receive God
- b) The key word: They must be sure they are "clean" before a Holy God

2. The Presence of God

- a) The mountain quaked
- b) Fire and darkness surrounded Mt. Sinai
- c) The Presence of God came with a tremendous display of power

3. The People of God

- a) They trembled as they listened to the voice of God
- b) God gave them 10 Commandments at Mt. Sinai

REMEMBERING THIS WONDERFUL MOMENT

Forty years later, Moses still remembered this special moment. He described it for a new generation of the children of Israel.

"The LORD came from Sinai,
And dawned on them from Seir;
He shone forth from Mount Paran,
And He came with ten thousands of saints;
From His right hand
Came a fiery law for them.
Deuteronomy 33:2

- 1. The Coming of the LORD
 - a) From Mount Sinai
 - b) From Mount Seir (in Edom)
 - c) From Mount Paran (in association with Sinai)

The mountains represented the Majesty and Powerful Presence of God!

- 2. With ten thousands of saints
 - a) The word "saints" It means holy ones
 - b) In this context this would be a reference
 - i) To the holy angels of God
 - ii) Rather than human saints
- 3. The law of God
 - a) This is a reference to the 10 Commandments
 - b) The law of God is to be held in the highest esteem
