

Dear Brethren.

Happy 48<sup>th</sup> Anniversary! Today, it is my great privilege and joy to stand before God and all of you (physically and virtually) to be ordained as a pastor in Bethany. I am deeply humbled and grateful to God for His exceedingly abundant grace, and to all of you for your love, prayers, encouragement and support. As I reflected on my journey to be a pastor, I would like to share a few lessons that the Lord has been teaching me in the last few years.

#### Servanthood

When I first began as a Student-Pastor, I was apprehensive about serving in areas beyond my comfort zone. I thought how nice it would be if I could focus on the ministries that I was comfortable with... but the Lord had other plans! He gave me opportunities to serve Him in new capacities, from preaching to children and seniors to planning our church concerts. Through these varied experiences, the Lord was teaching me that being His servant is not about my wants and preferences, but about His bidding for me as my Master. My part is to be faithful and responsible with every task He entrusts me to do. I am deeply challenged to live out the Lord Jesus' words in Luke 17:10 – To be an unprofitable servant, doing what is my duty to do.

### Sonship

There were difficult moments in ministry where I struggled with discouragement and feelings of inadequacy about being a pastor. In fact, there were a couple of times where I felt like doing a "Peter" in John 21:3, giving up and going back to my old trade! I thank God that in these low moments, I had Pastor to turn to. He gently encouraged me to focus on the fundamentals of being in ministry – my sonship with God. As I considered what it means to be a son to God through the Lord Jesus' example in John 5, I found a renewed perspective towards my calling as a pastor. It is not about the skills or gifts that I can offer to God, but about loving Him, obeying Him and being committed to do His will, even when the going gets tough. Thank God for this perspective of sonship, for it has helped me many a time to stay the course!

### Discipleship

A perennial feature of our pastoral training is the study of the Scriptures. Every morning for over 4 years, Pastor would devote much time to teach us the Word of God. He would correct our bad habits (e.g. reading our thoughts into a text, applying a verse out of context), instil the importance of being accurate, and inspire us to approach the Scriptures with rever-

ence and freshness. Through his example, I began to understand Paul's words in 2 Timothy 2:15: "Be diligent to present yourself approved to God, a worker who does not need to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth". It is not enough to merely spend time reading the Bible; one must be diligent to carefully interpret and apply the Word. Without the right approach and attitude towards the Scriptures, God would not open up His Word to me, and I would be found wanting. I am committed to learning how to be a good student of the Word, that I may rightly divide it and be approved to God!

### Shepherding

With front-row seats to ministry in Bethany, the Lord helped me to see the importance of being a good shepherd. As a good shepherd knows his sheep by name and cares for each one in a personal way (John 10), a pastor needs to know his brethren and care for each one personally. He must go beyond the confines of the pulpit to meet them where they are, for the needs are great. Over these years, I caught a glimpse of some of the needs among our brethren. Some of us struggle with physical and mental health challenges, relationship and family problems, as well as worries over studies, career and the future. There is so much that we can do as pastors to reach out and care for our brethren, to walk alongside you in your journey with the Lord. As I continue to serve the Lord in Bethany, I desire very much to be a good shepherd who knows and cares for our brethren.

### Spirit-filled

If there is one thing a pastor must endeavour to seek for all his life, it would be the filling of the Spirit of God. These formative years of training opened my eyes to the difficulties of being a good pastor. He needs to feed his congregation with a sound and relevant word from God every single week; he needs the wisdom to navigate difficult situations inside and outside the walls of the church; he must have the courage to stand for the Lord and His truth against opposition; he needs the Lord's leading to bring the church forward by faith. No man is sufficient for these things; it is a work that can only be undertaken by one who is filled with the Spirit of God. I thank God that we have such a Spirit-filled leader in Pastor, whom I can learn from and be inspired by. It is my challenge to humbly and earnestly seek the Lord for His Spirit's filling, that I may one day play my part to support His work in Bethany.

As I bow my knees before God and all of you to be ordained this morning, I am deeply conscious that ordination does not mark the end of my training, but a commencement of my journey to fulfil this calling, and a commitment to give my life and my all to the Lord and His people. May I continue to learn these lessons well, and press on in the upward call of God in Christ!



Dear Brethren,

A most blessed 40+8<sup>th</sup> Anniversary to all at Bethany! This day marks a significant milestone in my life as I am ordained for the Lord's work in Bethany.

I am grateful to God for His leading, and to Bethany for all the love and support extended to me as I sought to pursue and prepare for the full time ministry.

In this testimony, I would like to share the significant milestones of my life in the past few years, and bear witness of God's wonderful work in my life.

### Answering God's call

Ever since I found personal faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, I sought to discover God's plan for me as a believer. It took me years to discern and respond to God's call to serve in the full time ministry.

Despite the Lord stirring my heart towards the full time ministry in Bethany, I dismissed it foolishly at the beginning. I felt that I was not worthy to be a pastor because I had not grown up in Bethany, nor was I walking with the Lord in my younger days. However God was teaching me a most important lesson as He continued to stir in my heart. Ministry was never about me, but what God has purposed and would do in my life for His work.

God was patient and gracious toward me. God's call continued to grow until I could no longer ignore it. I confided in Pastor to understand what God was doing in my heart. God's confirmation came through His continued leading. The Church Session received me into pastoral training, and I was commissioned as a Student Pastor with Eugene on Christmas 2016.

### Training for the pastoral ministry

The first three years as a Student Pastor were marked by correction and change. There was much joy as I studied the Word of God each day, and as I learned to serve in the pastoral ministry. But there were also many moments of rebuke as God revealed to me the problems in my life that were hindering me from growing as a servant of the Lord. Through the Word of God (2 Timothy 3:16-17), God did a necessary work of correction and change in me before I could learn to build the right foundations for pastoral life and ministry.

As an Intern Pastor, I was challenged to go deeper in the cultivation of the following areas of my life.

- 1. Personal faith and the fruits of the Spirit
- 2. Prayer and meditation
- 3. The ability to rightly divide the Word of truth
- 4. The cultivation of a heart of a shepherd
- 5. The development of pastoral ministry skills

The 8-month Road to Ordination reading programme (Gospels and Epistles) was immensely helpful. I learnt to cultivate a personal discipline of dwelling on His Word, prayer, and reflecting on a weekly basis. Through this process, God made known to me the progress (and the lack of) that I had in these areas. He was always there to lovingly guide, encourage, and strengthen me to press on.

I give thanks for the work that He has done in my life as I trained for the pastoral ministry. These training years have been most enriching. As I consider the many valuable lessons that God had taught me over the past few years, I am aware that these initial years are but the beginning of a lifelong process of the continual training of a servant of God. I recognize how there is still so much more for me to learn and grow. I am challenged to always be sensitive and obedient to what God is teaching, to diligently follow the Example of our Lord Jesus Christ, and to constantly seek the Spirit's leading and filling for life and ministry (Numbers 27:18).

### Ordination and beyond

As I take the step of Ordination, my heart is filled with thanksgiving to God and to Bethany.

I am grateful to God for the awesome privilege of being called and ordained into the glorious ministry of the Gospel. I am a sinner saved by grace. It is by His grace that I can be counted as a servant of the Lord Jesus Christ.

I am also grateful to Bethany, the precious spiritual family that God has blessed me with. Bethany has received, encouraged, supported, ministered, and loved me and my family each step of the way.

As I begin ministry as an ordained pastor, I am challenged to walk worthy of calling with which I have been called (Ephesians 4:1), and to live up to the hopes and expectations of all in Bethany. I pray that I would be a shepherd to the flock of God according to what we read in Psalm 78:72.
