"SEEK MY FACE"

As David prayed to God, he was looking for answers to overcome the challenges before him. What shall he do with the encroaching enemies and foes? As he listened intently to what the Lord had to say, he found God's deep and profound response.

"When You said, "Seek My face,"
My heart said to You, "Your face, LORD, I will seek.""

PSALM 27:8

- 1. "Seek My Face"
 - a. God did not give David the answers he had expected
 - b. He admonished David to seek His face
 - c. The Lord was inviting him into a deeper relationship
- 2. "Your face, LORD, I will seek"
 - a. David responded to God's word in obedience and humility
 - b. He must have recognised that He had not been seeking God's face
 - c. He had sought answers and blessings from God
 - i. Deliverance from his wicked enemies
 - ii. Strength to cope with his immediate challenges
 - iii. Protection from those who were after his life
 - iv. Comfort and safety in the house of God
 - d. These do not constitute seeking the Lord's face

WHAT ARE YOU SEEKING?

Often, we are driven to pray because we desire God's blessings. We seek answers and immediate relief from the challenges of life. God has all authority and power to bless us physically, but the greater blessing is to possess a deep and personal relationship with Him. Let us be challenged to go beyond seeking God's hand of blessing to seek His face. Our prayers need not be filled with just our needs and wants, we must be challenged to relate to God and consider who He is to us personally.



REVIEW OF GOD'S WORD

Let us review what we have learnt at our last Youth Worship!

YWS MESSAGE - 5 FEBRUARY 2022 "AND ESAU SAW" GENESIS 28:6-9: 1 CORINTHIANS 2:6-16

INTRODUCTION

- 1. There are a number of aspects of understanding to consider
- 2. The following may be noted about the Human Being:
 - a. The Natural Aspect
 - i. The natural senses we are endowed with
 - ii. Without the involvement of the Spirit of God
 - b. The Spiritual Aspect
 - i Wisdom
 - ii. With the involvement of the Spirit of God

THE EXAMPLE OF ESAU

- 1. What Esau observed
 - **6** Esau saw that Isaac had blessed Jacob and sent him away to Padan Aram to take himself a wife from there, and that as he blessed him he gave him a charge, saying, "You shall not take a wife from the daughters of Canaan,"
 - **7** and that Jacob had obeyed his father and his mother and had gone to Padan Aram.

Genesis 28:6-7

- a. Isaac had blessed Jacob
- b. He had sent Jacob away to Padan Aram to find a wife
- c. That he had given Jacob a charge Not to marry a Canaanite woman

2. What Esau observed next

Also Esau saw that the daughters of Canaan did not please his father Isaac.

Genesis 28:8

- a. He noted that his wives did not please Isaac
- b. He wanted his father to be happy with him

3. What Esau did next

So Esau went to Ishmael and took Mahalath the daughter of Ishmael, Abraham's son, the sister of Nebajoth, to be his wife in addition to the wives he had.

Genesis 28:9

- a. He went to Ishmael's family
 - i. Ishmael was Abraham's son
 - ii. He was the older brother of Isaac
- b. He took a wife to add to his family of 2 wives
 - i. He already had two wives
 - ii. He assumed that a third wife might help a dysfunctional family situation

4. What Esau missed out on:

- a. The reasons why Jacob was sent away!
 - i. To prevent a murder
 - ii. To prevent a disastrous future of a possible bad marriage
- b. The spiritual aspects
 - i. Of the involvement of God
 - ii. Of faith in Him.
 - iii. Of spiritual values in character



AN IMPORTANT TEACHING FROM THE APOSTLE PAUL 1 Corinthians 2:6-16

- 1. Two Types of Wisdom distinguished
 - a. The wisdom of the world

Called "the wisdom of this age" 1 Corinthians 2:6

- i. Worldly wisdom
- ii. Natural wisdom
- b. The wisdom of God

"The hidden wisdom of God" 1 Corinthians 2:7

- i. Divine wisdom
- ii Biblical wisdom
- 2. The Wisdom of God

a. To many, it is "a mystery" 1 Corinthians 2:7a

b. It is "hidden" 1 Corinthians 2:7b

c. This is a wisdom ordained by God

"for our glory" 1 Corinthians 2:7c

3. To whom is this Wisdom of God revealed?

a. To those who are mature 1 Corinthians 2:6a

b To those who love Him 1 Corinthians 2.9c

4. How is this Wisdom revealed?

a. It is revealed through God's Spirit 1 Corinthians 2:10

b. It is revealed through His teaching

i. He compares spiritual things

with the spiritual 1 Corinthians 2:13

ii. It cannot be discerned

by "the natural man" 1 Corinthians 2:14a

iii. It is spiritually discerned 1 Corinthians 2:14b

REFLECTIONS

Just like that, the Chinese New Year holiday has come and gone. A tradition that cannot be separated from Chinese New Year celebrations is the tossing of yusheng. As chopsticks get tangled and shredded vegetables flung across dining tables, wishes for the new year ring out. In my family, it is often the time to joke around. Over the years, the wishes have evolved from 'score a 300 for PSLE!' to 'get a dog', but with the children of the family growing up, it almost seemed like we did not know what to wish for this year. Of course, these wishes were all said in jest, but as I listened to last week's Youth Worship message, I wondered to myself: this year, what do I really want to ask the Lord for?

Esau sees, Esau does

Esau knew what he wanted: to be blessed. He did not really understand where blessings came from, or how they worked, but he knew he wanted them. So when Jacob received yet another blessing from Isaac before he set off for Haran to find a wife, Esau's mind leapt to a

simplistic equation: if he were to marry a non-Canaanite, his father would be pleased with him, and he'd receive a blessing too!

Natural wisdom vs Spiritual wisdom

It is easy for us to shake our heads and laugh at Esau for coming to such a conclusion, but the truth is, we might have more in common with Esau than we would like to admit. Like Esau, we have a tendency to rely on the wisdom of the world. We use the knowledge of the world that we have accumulated, based on what we have seen or experienced, and we trust that this wisdom is enough to guide us in life. There is no deeper thought, and no consultation with the Lord. When we trust in this natural wisdom, we are self-reliant and determined to go through life depending on our own abilities.

An infinitely better wisdom to have is the hidden wisdom of God. First, we need to recognise that we lack this wisdom and we need to desire this wisdom for ourselves. It is a wisdom that is only revealed to those who are spiritually mature, to those who love the Lord. Perhaps we need to take the time to reflect and ask ourselves: have I been maturing spiritually? Can I say that I love the Lord personally?

A personal challenge

I wonder what you asked for as you tossed yusheng this year. For students, academic goals are usually the first thing to come to mind. After last week's message, I hope that you will be challenged to also consider setting spiritual goals for yourself.

Personally, I am challenged to desire this spiritual wisdom. I am challenged to want this wisdom for myself, and to diligently seek this wisdom as silver (Proverbs 2:4). How about you? What do you really want to ask the Lord for?
