GENESIS 31:24

REVIEW OF GOD'S WORD

Let us review what we have learnt at our last Youth Worship!

YWS MESSAGE -02 APRIL 2022 "RETURN TO THE LAND OF YOUR FATHERS" GENESIS 31:3

INTRODUCTION

- 1. Jacob had been in the land of Haran for a long time
- 2. He now had a family of 12 children
- 3. He had become wealthy and strong enough to leave Laban's employ

THE DETERIORATING CIRCUMSTANCES

1. The complaint of the sons of Laban

"Jacob has taken away all that was our father's, and from what was our father's he has acquired all this wealth."

Genesis 31:1

- a. This was a false accusation
- b. It reflects how Laban's family regarded Jacob
- c. Their observation was that Jacob was now very wealthy
- d. This wealth stemmed from Laban



- 2. The countenance of Laban
 - a. And Jacob saw the countenance of Laban, and indeed it was not favourable toward him as before.


Genesis 31:2

- b. This was vastly different from how he felt when he first saw Jacob
 - 13 Then it came to pass, when Laban heard the report about Jacob his sister's son, that he ran to meet him, and embraced him and kissed him, and brought him to his house. So he told Laban all these things. 14 And Laban said to him, "Surely you are my bone and my flesh." And he stayed with him for a month.

A WORD FROM THE LORD

Then the LORD said to Jacob, "Return to the land of your fathers and to your family, and I will be with you."

Genesis 31:3

- 1. The LORD took the initiative again
- 2. He spoke to Jacob
 - a. Directly
 - b. Personally
 - c. Clearly
 - i. Jacob is to return to his homeland
 - ii. God will be with him all the way

RESPONDING TO THE LORD'S WORD

- 1. He called Rachel and Leah for an urgent conference
 - a. Bilhah, Rachel's maid was not invited
 - b. Zilpah, Leah's maid was not included either
 - c. They may have borne children for Jacob but their official role was still that of a maid
- 2. The Place of Meeting
 - a. In a field
 - b. Among his flock Genesis 31:4
 - c. The home was not the safest place to have this secret conference



A VERY CANDID FAMILY CONFERENCE

4 So Jacob sent and called Rachel and Leah to the field, to his flock,

5 and said to them, "I see your father's countenance, that it is not favourable toward me as before; but the God of my father has been with me.
6 And you know that with all my might I have served your father.
7 Yet your father has deceived me and changed my wages ten times, but

God did not allow him to hurt me. **8** If he said thus: 'The speckled shall be your wages,' then all the flocks bore speckled. REFLECTION

What is your first course of action when you're stuck in a complex circumstance? Personally, I don't do well with managing complex circumstances. I am quick to feel anxious and would much rather escape rather than face it head-on. It thus took me by surprise when we learnt about how calm and collected Jacob was in the way he read the circumstances of life and dealt with the heat of tense family relationships.

Reading the circumstances of life

We have all read the circumstances in life that lead us to respond accordingly. These circumstances include: Making big life choices that would affect our lives in the long term or smaller things like how to relate to a friend who is in need. We look at the circumstances surrounding the decision, and make a judgment on the next course of action.

Very often, we view these circumstances through our own lenses. We decide the next course of action based on what we think is the most "logical" after weighing the pros and cons. This is a good and necessary practice, but we may not always be the best readers of our circumstances.

We must learn to read life's circumstances with wisdom. In Jacob's case, he had worked tirelessly under Laban for 14 years and counting. He knew Laban's character and the woes of working for him. Not only that, Jacob had wisdom from the Lord to make a correct corresponding response to persevere through the hardships.

Jacob had learnt to read the circumstances, and he knew his relatives were not pleased. In fact, his father-in-law's countenance was unfavourable toward him. An immediate human response would be to fear and fret. But how was Jacob so unusually calm?

The ultimate Decision Maker

God confirmed Jacob's plan to return to the land of Canaan with a clear word. The Lord was the ultimate Decision Maker. God guided Jacob to return to the land of his fathers. However, God did not simply stop at telling Jacob what to do. God promised His presence. This meant that Jacob could face his difficulty with peace and confidence. There was no need to second-guess his decision to return to Canaan.

The Lord was guiding Jacob and the ball was now in Jacob's court. Would he trust God?

A trusting response

A seemingly valid question would be to ask God questions about his return to Canaan. How feasible was this plan? Was he to bring everyone including Rachel and Leah?

However, Jacob's mind was not fixated on how he was going to leave for Canaan, or who to bring along with him. Instead, Jacob was acutely aware that though he was in a difficult and dangerous circumstance, God was with him. God did not allow Laban to hurt Jacob (Genesis 31:7). He was the God of Bethel (the place where God first encountered Jacob as he was fleeing from Esau). God was reminding Jacob once again that as He was with him when he fled from Esau, He would be with him once again as he fled from Laban.

With such assurance, Jacob obeyed God and related to Rachel and Leah the plan to return to his own country.

Conclusion

God helped Jacob to respond well. Jacob's wisdom to read the circumstances did not come from nowhere. His boldness and clear direction to return to the land of his fathers were a result of God's confirming word to him. On Jacob's part, it was to trust the Lord's guidance and to obey Him.

Though we might not face the same set of circumstances as Jacob, I'm sure that we all have experienced a fair share of complex circumstances that make us feel stuck or helpless. As I face different circumstances each day, I am challenged to first ask the Lord for guidance on how to read them. This guidance comes from relating to the Lord and the reading of His word for instruction. Not only so, the greater challenge then is to likewise have the same trusting response as Jacob. So the next time you encounter a complex circumstance in life, what will your first course of action be? May it be a response of seeking the Lord humbly and applying faith and trust in the Lord to face the situation!

Message: "God has seen my affliction and the labour of my hands" Text: Genesis 31:42

We read of Laban's relentless pursuit of Jacob and his family. They were unharmed by Laban because of God's divine and timely intervention. God's hand of protection was certainly unmistakable!

One would wonder whether Jacob's faith was outstanding at this juncture. The Angel of God had reassured Jacob that his afflictions were not unnoticed (Genesis 31:12). Jacob was to return to Canaan and God would be with him and bring him back to the land (Genesis 28:15).

Unfortunately, fear loomed larger than faith! It was fear that drove Jacob to flee from Laban's wrath. He failed to follow through in exercising his trust in the Lord's promises. What lessons can we learn from the difficult circumstances of life? What is the Lord teaching us as we face hardships?
