





#### Calling back to Bethel

In the midst of these great troubles, it was God who reached out to Jacob. "Arise, go up to Bethel and dwell there" (Genesis 35:1), God was calling Jacob back to Him and instructing him to seek a spiritual reset. It would not

be Jacob's first time at Bethel. Years ago, he had spent the night there while on the run from

his brother Esau (Genesis 28). It was there that God had first promised him, "I am with you and will keep you wherever you go." (Genesis 28:15a)
Bethel surely had a significant meaning to Jacob, it was where he first encountered God personally, and where such a wonderful promise had been given.

#### A spiritual reset

Appearing before God in Bethel, Jacob chose to return to his spiritual roots. He was reminded of the God who had promised to be with him always, and was reminded of the relationship he had with God. Was this not the same God who had watched over him in the 20 years he worked for Laban? Not only did Jacob leave Laban unharmed, he also accumulated great wealth. Was this not the same God who promised to bring Jacob back to his country in peace? Not only did Esau not attack Jacob, but he embraced and kissed him. Jacob had experienced God's grace time after time. Now once again in this period of tribulation, Jacob was reminded of the Lord's grace.

#### Personal application

There are times in our lives when it is necessary for a spiritual reset. Jacob sought a reset as neighbouring cities threatened to destroy him and as his family made him realise he needed a return to God. For us, it could be family issues or challenges faced in school that make us realise that we have not learnt the right spiritual lessons. We need a spiritual reset to renew our walk with God. We need to come before Him humbly, and remember that not only is God the God of Jacob, but also the God of Bethel. Bethel is different for each and every one of us, it is the place where we first came to faith and found our faith personal and real. Our God is not just One whom we read of in the Bible, but a God that is living and alive. We all have a personal relationship with Him, and all of us have our own unique journey of faith.

While we may not face daunting circumstances as Jacob did, we need to consider whether we too need a spiritual reset. It could be lessons of trusting in God and seeking His wisdom, or about prayer and its importance in our lives. These were lessons I needed to relearn as I faced important decisions and felt uncertain about my path in JC. The problem of pride is something I continue to deal with when I am too proud to admit I need God and attempt to stand on my own. There are times I feel lost and I doubt where God is leading me. I draw encouragement from Jacob. He had stumbled over and over, and yet God still graciously called him back to Bethel to seek a reset. The spiritual reset I am seeking is not one that happens overnight, but a process. I am comforted to know that God is working in my life, and that my faith can only grow stronger as He works in me.

As we approach the second half of 2022, we are sure to face more challenges. Our task is to arise, go up to Bethel and dwell there. We must recall our personal walk with God. What has He done for us in the past and how have we grown? We must renew the relationship we have with Him. What part does God play in our lives now and how can He play a greater part? We must rejuvenate our faith. Are we trusting in Him and are we confident in His work in our lives?

May we all choose to return to Bethel, and find encouragement in both His promise and past works.

## DEALING WITH PROBLEMS THROUGH A SPIRITUAL RESET

Our human sinful ways see us run into problems which could leave us in a cul-de-sac. The wisest thing to do is return to the Lord, wiping the slate clean with a spiritual "reset". "Reset", however, is not vain repetition of human solutions in hope of a better outcome, Rather, it is about choosing God's ways over our own — that is when change will come!

A spiritual reset revisits spiritual truths previously taught, but learnt only theoretically. Yet when applied consciously, once theoretical truths can become a wonderful reality! Consider, the significance naming Jacob as "Israel" — it was not understood initially, Only amidst problems could God teach Jacob what the name meant symbolically.

"God Almighty" was now no longer just a saying of old passed down from his forefathers, Jacob now personally recognised who God is — this is God Almighty, above all others! Beyond reminding Jacob of who He is, God further revealed His wonderful divine plan, The Abrahamic covenant extended to Jacob's lineage — they would dwell in the land!

Do we see problems in our lives that are the result of our sinful and human ways?

Let us be brave enough to deal with them, seeking God for His help every day.

As with Jacob, amidst problems, God patiently teaches lessons of faith for us to learn,

That we may renounce our sinful ways and for a closer walk with Him continually yearn.
