She died giving birth to Benjamin Genesis 35:16-20

3. The death of Isaac Genesis 35:27-29

THE EVIL DEED OF REUBEN

1. He lay with Bilhah, Rachel's maidservant

a. She was Jacob's concubine Genesis 35:22

b. She was the mother of:

i. Dan

ii. Naphtali Genesis 35:25

2. Israel (Jacob)

a. He heard about this Genesis 35:22

b. He did nothing



REMEMBERING GOD'S PROMISE TO ISRAEL

9 Then God appeared to Jacob again, when he came from Padan Aram, and blessed him.

10 And God said to him, "Your name *is* Jacob; your name shall not be called Jacob anymore, but Israel shall be your name." So He called his name Israel.

11 Also God said to him: "I am God Almighty. Be fruitful and multiply; a nation and a company of nations shall proceed from you, and kings shall come from your body.

12 The land which I gave Abraham and Isaac I give to you; and to your descendants after you I give this land."

Genesis 35:9-12

1. Significant name change

Jacob to Israel

Genesis 35:10

- 2. God's promise to Jacob concerning his descendants
 - a. A nation will proceed from him
 - b. A company of nations will proceed (one day)
 - c. Kings shall come from his body

WHAT DOES IT TAKE TO BELIEVE IN THESE PROMISES OF GOD?

- 1. The children of Jacob
 - a. They were idolatrous
 - b. Simeon and Levi were cunning and wicked
 - c. Reuben was also wicked!

- 2. It would take the following:
 - a. Knowledge of the Lord as "God Almighty"
 - b. A growing Faith in God
 - c. A strong relationship with God



THE AREAS OF WEAKNESSES AND SINS THAT HINDER

- 1. Poor parenting
 - a. Jacob was not a great father
 - b. Leah and Rachel were too caught up with fighting each other
 - c. The maid-servants did not appear to be very significant as mothers
- 2. Poor growth on the part of the children
 - a. They are responsible for their own personal growth
 - b. They did not grow very well
 - c. Hence, the problems that arose!

CONCLUSION

- 1. Be challenged to cultivate:
 - a. A strong faith in God
 - b. A significant walk with the Lord



REFLECTION



Last week, we learnt that Jacob's sons were labelled as "sons of Jacob", associating them with Jacob's (now Israel) sinful past. They lacked spiritual guidance from Jacob who was only biologically their father and did not have a deep relationship with them. As such, the sons of Jacob did not cultivate faith in their Heavenly Father, and were shaped by the ways of the world.


Faith – a Personal Responsibility

Some of us are privileged to have parents who guide us with the Lord's word and teach us what it means to have faith or what faith is about. However, it may not be the case for every single person. Jacob's sons did not have the privilege to have their parents guide them on spiritual matters. It's ultimately our responsibility to take charge of our own faith. For Jacob's sons, they did not take responsibility to seek and cultivate a personal faith and relationship with God. They ended up having a sinful and wicked heart, instead of one that was after God's. Such can be seen when Simeon and Levi massacred the men in the city of Shechem and when Reuben slept with Bilhah, his father's concubine.

At the end of the day, we cannot blame anyone for the state of our faith. It is something we ourselves are responsible for. Whether or not our parents provide us with spiritual guidance, the onus is on us to take charge of our spiritual walk with the Lord.

A Faith I Call Mine

This lesson reminded me of how I need to take ownership of growing my own faith and not be completely reliant on others to help me grow in my faith. I must personally seek to cultivate a deeper relationship with God. It's easy to think we're growing spiritually when we're preoccupied with our growing involvement in church as activities resume. But beneath these external activities, do we desire to have faith and a relationship with God? It's not always a smooth-sailing journey, I admittedly still find myself struggling with consistency. Yet, I find comfort in the fact that I can always have that spiritual reset. This is MY walk of faith and at the end of the day, I would
