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COME AND WORSHIP

The Lord knows the way of the righteous

The Psalmist painted a beautiful imagery of the righteous who is blessed by God (Psalm 1:3). He shall be like a fresh and flourishing tree! To better appreciate the special blessings bestowed upon the righteous, the Psalmist depicted a contrasting imagery of the ungodly, from whom the blessings of God are withdrawn.

4 "The ungodly are not so,

But *are* like the chaff which the wind drives away.

5 Therefore the ungodly shall not stand in the judgment,
Nor sinners in the congregation of the righteous.

6 For the LORD knows the way of the righteous, But the way of the ungodly shall perish."

PSALM 1:4-6

- 1. The ungodly is likened to the chaff
 - a. The winnowing process separates the worthless chaff from the grain
 - b. The mixture is tossed upwards
 - i. The heavy grain falls to the ground
 - ii. The featherlight chaff is blown away by the wind

- 2. God discerns between the righteous and the ungodly
 - a. The Lord is the Ultimate Judge
 - b. He draws a clear line between the righteous and the ungodly
 - c. They can be distinguished by their chosen paths in life
 - i. The ungodly is sinful and scornful Psalm 1:1
 - ii. The righteous delights in God and His word Psalm 1:2
 - d. The way of the ungodly will lead to destruction
- 3. Our challenge
 - a. Cherish God and His blessings
 - b. Choose the righteous path

A CLEAR AND CONSIDERED CHOICE

Everyone hopes to enjoy in the blessings of God. Some may even employ unlawful means to attain prosperity. Many fail to recognise that blessings come from none other than the Lord Himself and He bestows them upon those who have chosen to walk in His righteous ways.

To the Psalmist, there are two distinct paths in life

- 1. The righteous way that leads us to prosper
- 2. The ungodly way that leads us to perish

The Psalmist had chosen to reject the world's sinful ways and devote himself to cultivating his relationship with God and meditating on His Word (Psalm 1:2).

What have you chosen? Let us not be found sitting on the fence. Instead, let us make the clear and considered choice to walk on the path of blessing from God. Let us choose to love the Lord and humbly receive the encouragement of the Psalmist to dedicate time for God's word!

YWS MESSAGE - 3 SEPTEMBER 2022 "DO NOT INTERPRETATIONS BELONG TO GOD?" GENESIS 40:8

INTRODUCTION

- 1. Joseph was sent to prison on a trumped-up charge
- 2. But God was with him, even in prison
- 3. He served as the assistant of the prison warden

TWO SPECIAL PRISONERS

- 1. The chief butler
- 2. The chief baker

Both had been sent to prison because they had offended the Pharaoh

Genesis 40:3

THE DREAMS OF THE PRISONERS

1. Joseph noted the sad looks of the prisoners Genesis 40:6

2. He asked why they looked so sad Genesis 40:7

3. They each had a dream but did not knowhow to interpret themGenesis 40:8a



JOSEPH OFFERED HIS HELP

- 1. Joseph had some understanding of dreams Genesis 37
- 2. He had two special personal dreams previously
 - a. A dream of sheaves bowing to his sheaf
 - b. A dream of stars, and the sun and moon bowing to him
- 3. His statement to the prisoners "Do not interpretations belong to God?"

Genesis 40:8b

4. He encouraged the prisoners to share their dreams

THE DREAM OF THE CHIEF BUTLER

- 1. A dream of a vine
 - a. A vine with three branches
 - b. They brought forth grapes
 - c. The grapes were made into wine
 - d. The butler served the Pharaoh the wine Genesis 40:9-11
- 2. The interpretation of the dream by Joseph
 - a. The three branches are three days
 - b. The butler would be restored to his former position

Genesis 40:12-13

- 3. A request of Joseph
 - a. He asked the butler to put in a good word to the Pharaoh
 - b. He briefly shared his problem ofbeing a prisonerGenesis 40:14-15

THE DREAM OF THE CHIEF BAKER

- 1. He had a dream of three baskets on his head
- 2. The uppermost basket had all kinds of baked goods for the Pharaoh
- 3. The birds ate the baked goods

Genesis 40:16-17

THE INTERPRETATION OF THE DREAM BY JOSEPH

- 1. This dream was not a good one
- 2. Within three days, the chief baker would be executed

Genesis 40:18-19

THE FULFILMENT OF THE INTERPRETATION OF THE DREAMS

- On the Pharaoh's birthday
 This coincided with the 3rd day of the dreams shared
- 2. Things happened exactly as Joseph had said
 - a. The chief butler was restored

Genesis 40:21

b. The chief baker was hanged

Genesis 40:22

- 3. Did the chief butler remember Joseph's request? No! He forgot all about Joseph
- 4. Was the LORD with Joseph even though he was forgotten by the chief butler?

Yes!

A HISTORICAL PSALM

16 Moreover He called for a famine in the land; He destroyed all the provision of bread.

17 He sent a man before them— Joseph—who was sold as a slave.

18 They hurt his feet with fetters, He was laid in irons.

19 Until the time that his word came to pass, The word of the LORD tested him.

20 The king sent and released him, The ruler of the people let him go free.


21 He made him lord of his house, And ruler of all his possessions,

22 To bind his princes at his pleasure, And teach his elders wisdom.

LESSONS FROM THIS PSALM

- 1. Joseph was initially badly treated in prison
 - a. He was fettered
 - b. He was laid in irons
- The LORD was with himHe became the assistant to the prison warden



- 3. His prison stay was a time of testing
- 4. Until the word of the LORD came to pass

CONCLUSION

- 1. The truth-principle must be trusted "The LORD was with him"
- Genesis 39:2, 21
- 2. Man may forget, but God will not
- 3. The LORD's plan will come to pass

"I am with you"

If one were to ask you for a verse to dwell on during the exam season, I'm sure many of us would point to Isaiah 41:10.

It reads:

66

Fear not, for I am with you;
Be not dismayed, for I am your God.
I will strengthen you,
Yes, I will help you,
I will uphold you with
My righteous right hand.

ISAIAH 41:10

We hold the promise of God's presence close to our hearts when we go through tough times. (for example: during exams). We use it to fight fears that threaten to overwhelm us. We cling on to it as a source of comfort when we feel alone.

Though it is good to appreciate God's presence with us in the trying seasons of our lives, it is not the only way in which we can appreciate His presence with us.

We can appreciate how He is with us, in every aspect of our lives. Some of these aspects include the way God would move us to serve, care for one another and share our faith.

Joseph's life:

These aspects were seen in Joseph's life. God was with Joseph as he sought to serve in prison, care for the prisoners and share his faith with them.

Though Joseph was initially badly treated in prison, the Lord was with him. Trust and responsibility were given to Joseph. He eventually served in prison by becoming assistant to the prison warden.

The manner in which Joseph served was also of significance. He cared for the prisoners. This was demonstrated when he saw that the prisoners looked down (Genesis 40:6). Joseph asked after them (Genesis 40:7). He encouraged the prisoners to share about the dreams which troubled them (Genesis 40:8).

Joseph did not stop at caring for them. He shared his faith with the prisoners (Genesis 40:8b). He pointed them to the Lord when he interpreted their dreams.

Joseph served in prison, he cared for the prisoners and even went on to share his faith with them. Who guided Joseph to do all these things? It was the Lord! He was with Joseph throughout his life, even when he was in prison (Genesis 39:2, 21)

A promise we can appreciate in every season of life:

As the Lord was with Joseph, He is with us too. I'm beginning to appreciate the promise of God being with me in a new way.

When I was younger, the assurance that He would be with me was appreciated in the context of exams and trying seasons. However, I'm beginning to appreciate the reality of this truth-principle in other areas of my life.

When God is with us, acts of service, care and the sharing of our faith would flow from our life naturally.

I am praying that the Lord will continue to be with me, and guide me, as I seek to walk with Him- whether it be in service, caring for others and sharing my faith with friends who have yet to come to believe in the Lord!
